## Prayer

#### 1. Should we ever stop praying for something or someone

- Scripture is conclusive on this - 1 Thessalonians 5:17

- There isn't <u>anything</u> that we can't or shouldn't pray about
- Paul prayed for the Church in Colossae without ceasing Colossians 1:9
- Paul does this again in Romans 1:9
- Pray without ceasing a continual state of prayer
- This is like depending on God like we depend on breathing
- One other thing that we can learn from this is we never give up on prayer
- So should we ever stop praying, NO!

#### 2. What if I am "giving it to God", can I then stop praying?

- Sometimes praying about an anxious situation can make you anxious
- For some people to thinking about a topic can make them anxious
- Can you in certain situations stop praying and "give it to God"?
- Paul would disagree with this logic
- I would say it's a separate issue
- You shouldn't be anxious because God provides Philippians 4:6

#### 3. What to do if You don't know what to say?

- In a tragic event or a crisis situation you often can't even form words
- It's good that God knows the heart for those hard times -1 Samuel 16:7
- God knows the heart and intentions behind prayer Romans 8:26
- Often times this is used as a reason to not pray
- I would say it's a reason that you should pray
- This in time will get easier and prayer will come more naturally
- We continue to pray through all seasons of life

- There is <u>always</u> something to be thankful for, something you're going through or something coming up

- This isn't to mention other people that we can be praying for

# 4. Is it acceptable to repeatedly pray for the same thing, or should we only ask once?

- A lot of times we don't get the answer that we would want in our timing

- A lot of times its not in a way that we would think

- There is a perseverance that is <u>needed</u> in prayer – Acts 6:4

- To get through the hard times and to continue to follow the Lord we need to repeatedly pray

- It might take moments, days, months, years, decades or it might not happen

- We still make our requests known to God – Nehemiah 4:9

- You should always keep on praying - Psalm 5:3

### 5. How can I be sure I am praying according to the will of God?

- You can break Gods will up into two different things

- Gods general will and Gods specific will
- Gods general will He has not hidden this from us 2 Thessalonians 4:2
- Scripture tells us Gods general will for us
- Gods specific will is what is <u>not</u> spelled out in scripture
- Scripture doesn't tell you who you may marry or what job will you have
- How do you determine what God specific will is for your life
- 1<sup>st</sup>, you pray and seek the Lord. Everything should start and continue in prayer
- 2<sup>nd</sup>, You should look at the ways in God has designed you
- We all have different spiritual gifts and interests 1 Corinthians 12:1-11
- Often times what God specifically wants for your life will fall into place
- When he wants you to know, he will make it known in His timing
- In the mean time we pray and faithful follow him Jude 20
- So how to be sure you are praying Gods will?
- If its contrary to scripture it's **NOT** Gods will
