1. Unanswered prayers?

- I don't like the words unanswered prayers
- Jesus gives us encouragement that we are heard Matthew 7:7-8
- When we don't get the answer that we want we often give up
- Luke 8:1-8
- A lot of times we need perseverance in **prayer**
- All of our prayers are answered, they just might not be answered when we want or how we want
- We must continually ask and seek him Ephesians 3:20
- Good <u>fathers</u> don't always say yes
- Regardless of what his answers are we are to continually come to him
- Often times when we think we have an unanswered prayer it's because he hasn't answered it in the way that we wanted.
- There is no **<u>prayer</u>** left unanswered James 4:3
- "Nothing is better adapted to excite us to prayer than a full conviction that we shall be heard." John Calvin

2. What is intercessory prayer?

- This is someone else praying for you
- When you ask someone for prayer this is what we are doing
- We are asking them to intercede on our behalf
- When you pray for someone else you are doing this

- This is **different** than Catholicism's intercession

3. Does prayer change Gods mind?

- The whole reason we pray is because God is sovereign
- Exodus 32:11
- Moses **sought** the Lord on behalf of the Israelites
- God is the same and doesn't change Hebrews 13:8
- Prayer doesn't change the nature of God
- To change Gods mind would mean that God hasn't made everything perfect
- This means for all of eternity God doesn't change
- We **cannot** change Gods mind
- We pray because it does move the hand of God
- God is **physically** doing something in response to prayer
- Prayer in not an afterthought or a plan b in Gods eyes
- Instead of using prayer as a spare tire let's use it as a steering wheel
- God has <u>never</u> changed his mind from the foundation of the world
