LESSON FIFTY-ONE COMMENTS

Dear Loved Ones,

One of the most common emotions that a widow or widower sudden faces is <u>fear</u>. How can I manage without the other person? What will the many changes in life mean? What needs to be done to not only handle funeral costs but also future costs? Who will be there for me when I need something? Who is depending on me? They were my other half. How will I feel whole again?

Did you know that the phrase 'fear not' is mentioned in the Bible 365 times? Isn't that interesting? Our redeemer, Jesus, wants us to know every day of the year that He understands our fears, but He wants to offer everything we need to 'fear not'.

Ruth's redeemer seemed to understand Ruth's fears also. His quick response was to talk to her like a daughter and reassure her to 'fear not'. He also wanted to fulfill her request as well as His rightful responsibilities, but he reassured her that he would protect her. He honored her as a virtuous woman.

Proverbs 31, in a book known for being filled with wisdom, concludes with some powerful verses concerning a virtuous woman.
