## LESSON FIFTY-FOUR AND FIFTY-FIVE COMMENTS

Dear Loved Ones,

Have you noticed that when you were a child, you were often identified as your parent's child, but it isn't long until you became identified as your child's parent? As a parent, it feels weird when you first realize that your child now has their own identity, and you are somehow second in importance at times.

We like to think that we have our own identity and yet it is also a privilege to be identified in a relationship with someone else. When a woman marries, it is usually a great sense of pride to be called 'Mrs.' Ruth was in the position of possibly becoming 'Mrs' in our story today. Naomi cared deeply for Ruth and hoped to see her life improved by marrying Boaz. Not long before that, Ruth was the one who was caring deeply for her Mother-in-Law when she made a commitment to Naomi. Prior to this part of our story she was mostly known to be the daughter-in-law to Naomi.

Do you remember the words of Ruth in <u>Ruth 1:16 to 17?</u> "And Ruth said, Intreat me not to leave thee, or to return from following after thee: for whither thou goest, I will go; and where thou lodgest, I will lodge: thy people shall be my people, and thy God my God: 17-Where thou diest, will I die, and there will I be buried: the Lord do so to me, and more also, if ought but death part to me."?

Those words were a strong commitment for a daughter-in-law to make to her mother-in-law at that time, but she truly loved Naomi. Those words are still often used in wedding ceremonies. When a wife makes a commitment to her husband, she makes a commitment to become one with him in every way. That is God's design for a good marriage.
