## **LESSON FIFTY-SIX COMMENTS**

Dear Loved Ones,

To everything there is a season. It is amazing that these Biblical words became a popular Rock and Roll song. Many of us are becoming very aware of the seasons of our lives as we get older. Each season brings certain its own benefits, joys, trials, and responsibilities. When we are younger, we look forward to each new event. As we age, we don't seem to have as many of this world's things to look forward to, especially if there are as many family ties in our lives.

In Phillipians 4:12, Paul says, "I know how to live on almost nothing or with everything. I have learned the secret of living in every situation, whether it is with a **full** stomach or **empty**, with plenty or little."
