LESSON TWENTY-TWO COMMENTS

Dear Loved Ones,

Although Jesus knew His purpose on earth was to die for our sins, He said "Father, if you are willing, please take this cup of suffering from me, Yet I want your will to be done, not mine." Can you imagine the struggle that He faced? But have you also ever thought about the pain it caused God to give His only begotten son for us? As parents, we used to hear that parents would tell their kids that this spanking will hurt you more than me. Physical pain is awful but so is emotional pain. The hardest part for Jesus was the weight of our sin and separation from his Father while that sin was upon Him. Yet the relationship factor can also a very intense pain. Sometimes I wondered why God waited so long to send His son to redeem us until I think about how hard it must have been to send Him to go through this pain.

Sometimes our pain is so strong that our spirit becomes immensely weak. It becomes so much harder to lift our sprit up into the presence of the one who can provide the help and answers that we know we need.
