## **NAOMI - RUTH CONNECTION**

## LESSON SEVENTY-ONE: RUTH 4:13a

"So Boaz took Ruth, and she was his wife."

Who doesn't like a happy ending? The Book of Ruth began with a famine and three deaths. This was followed by poverty and hard work. But, in the end, our ladies recovered lost property, found a husband for Ruth, and celebrated the birth of the much-wanted heir to the family name and legacy.

Boaz got his happy ending, too. From the time that he first laid eyes on Ruth Boaz wanted her for his bride. He waited patiently for her to indicate that she wanted him to redeem her. Meanwhile, he did all that he could to ensure that she had an adequate food supply and a safe work environment. He protected her reputation. And he negotiated on her behalf the redemption of the family land, as well as her own redemption as the childless widow. In the end, "Boaz took Ruth, and she was his wife."

Wouldn't it be great if life always worked out that way? If only we could all be guaranteed a happy ending it would take some of the stress out of our lives. Sometimes life does work out like this. Sometimes it doesn't. But a happy ending is not a goal to strive for. It may be <u>hoped</u> for. Even prayed for! But our goal in everything we do should be to glorify God (I Cor. 10:31).
