The Lion and the Lamb part 2 April 2025

The Lamb of God is a title for Jesus Christ symbolizing His role as the final ultimate sacrificial offering for the sins of humanity. This is rooted in the Old Testament sacrificial practices and culminated in Jesus' crucifixion.

Understanding the Passover lamb in the Old Testament:

-the first Passover lamb. Exodus 12. The blood of the lamb was applied to the side and upper door posts to protect the Israelites from the Lord's angel of death killing all firstborn in the land of Egypt. This Passover lamb foreshadowed Jesus' sacrifice of His own blood and body for the redemption of humanity.

-later Passover lambs were offered as sacrifices during the Passover to remember the Israelite's deliverance from slavery in Egypt.

The sacrificial system in the Old Testament established a broad system of animal sacrifice atoning for sins. The sacrifices served as temporary coverings for sin but were not a permanent solution.

Hebrews 10:1-18. Jesus Christ died once for ALL-the ultimate and final sacrifice. The prophets foretold of this. Isaiah 53. Often called the servant song, it speaks of a gentle, innocent lamb led to slaughter foreshadowing Jesus suffering and death for the sins of others. He bore the sins of many and makes intercession for the transgressors.

John 1:29-John the Baptist's testimony. John, upon seeing Jesus coming towards him, declared "Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." Not just John's sin, not just the Jew's sin, but the world's sin! Praise God there is no longer a need for the Old Testament's temporary sacrifices! Jesus death on the cross was the ultimate atonement for the sin of humanity. The perfect and final sacrifice to fulfill the sacrificial system established in the Old Testament.

Redemption and new life. Jesus' sacrifice provides forgiveness of sins and a restored relationship with God. Jesus' death and resurrection open the way to a new life through Christ. His blood covers sin and offers hope for all. However, you must "open the door (your heart)" to accept the relationship.

A lamb's blood is used as an anti-venom to treat a pit viper's bite. Sin was brought into the world because the serpent tempted Eve and both Eve and Adam chose self over God and disobeyed God which brought sin into the world. Ultimately, the blood of the Lamb Jesus Christ will reverse this, just as the anti-venom from a lamb's blood reverses the damage caused by a pit viper snake bite.
